Acknowledging students meeting remote learning expectations

As we plan for remote learning, acknowledging students and families will be more important than ever for building and maintaining relationships, giving feedback to students so they know they are on the right track, and showing students and families their efforts are noticed and valued.

Acknowledge students for:

- Meeting your established classroom agreements/rules (Being a respectful/responsible/role model by...)
- Being on time for the lesson
- Greeting the teacher and/or classmates
- Getting dressed for the day
- Having necessary materials ready
- Actively participating in class by having your video on, sharing out loud, using non-verbal cues (thumbs up, hand raise, etc.), typing in the chat feature
- Asking clarifying questions before/during after class
- Completing and turning in assignments
- Asking for help
- · Helping classmates in need of support
- Turning microphone to mute when others are speaking
- Using the chat/online features appropriately
- Meeting class-wide/student daily or weekly goal for meeting expectations (i.e., after 80% of class attends the lesson five days in a row)

Send a note/postcard home to families thanking them for their effort and support
